

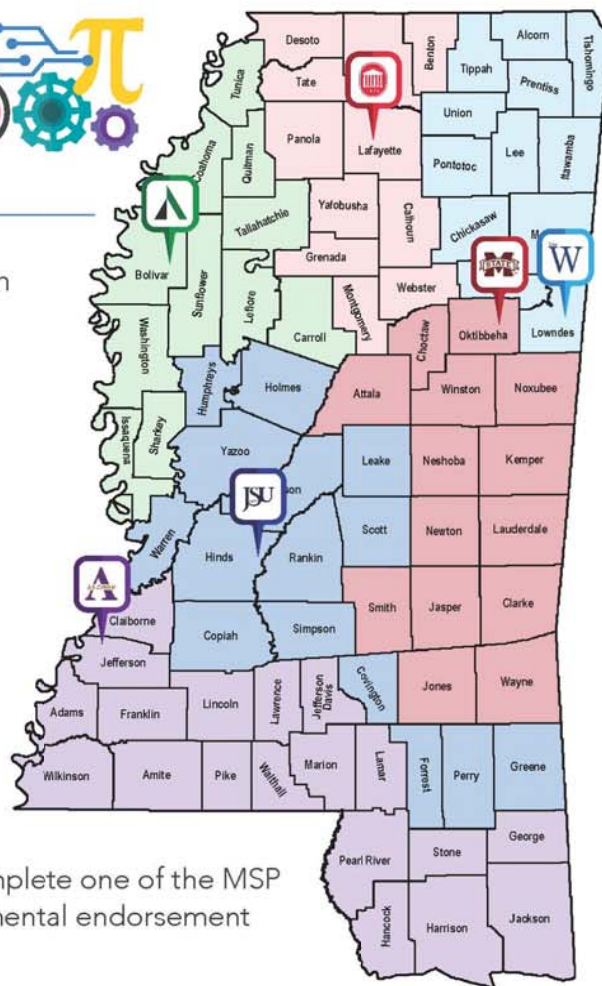
PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The MSP program supports improved student achievement in mathematics and science through intense training for classroom teachers through enriched instructional support and intensive, high-quality professional development activities that focus on deepening teachers' content knowledge.

This program year targets grades K-8 mathematics teachers in high-need schools. The term "high-need school" refers to a school meeting at least two of the following criteria:

- 40% of the students qualify for free or reduced lunch and/or Title I;
- 40% of the students are low performing on statewide assessments in the area of mathematics; and/or
- 10% of teachers are not teaching in the academic subject that they were trained to teach.

Elementary Education and Special Education teachers who complete one of the MSP programs can add the middle-grade, Math Grades 7-8 supplemental endorsement (901 or 905) to their elementary or special education license.



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
